My research work primarily focused on Indian foreign policy with China, Malaysia, Indonesia and the Indochina States of Southeast Asia, India’s Look East and Act East policies, conflict resolution with special reference to Cambodia and East Timor, traditional and non-traditional security threats in Southeast Asia with special reference to environment, terrorism, South China Sea, etc. issues, marginalization and economic status of Malaysian Indians in Malaysia, Gender participation in Malaysian General Elections, Multilateralism with special reference to regional and sub-regional organizations in South and Southeast Asian regions (mainly ASEAN and SAARC), impact of coalition politics on Indian foreign policy in recent years and comparative analyses of UPA and NDA governments’ foreign policies towards its South Asian neighbours. Besides Area Studies, my other fields of research included some aspects of Indian political thought, with special reference to Kautilya, Mahatma Gandhi, Rabindranath Tagore, Vivekananda, M.N. Roy and the foreign policy ideas of socialist thinkers such as Jayaprakash Narayan, RammanoharLohia and Acharya Narendra Deva.
